Blandine House Admissions Process

At Blandine House Inc. our caring team of experienced professionals provides alcohol and drug addiction treatment for men, age 18 years and older. Men come to Blandine from a variety of referral sources: the family, a detox center, a past client, or an outpatient counselor.

Admission to a long-term residential treatment like Blandine House can be stressful, however, it may be the only way to find freedom from the hold of drug and alcohol addiction. At Blandine House, we try to help all clients feel welcome throughout their time at our treatment center, from their initial admission to their newfound freedom at discharge.

We offer a continuum of treatment for addiction including our 90-day residential program, transitional living (halfway house) and complementary outpatient services, including aftercare. It is important to note that Blandine is not a dual-diagnosis treatment facility. Blandine treats clients whose substance abuse addiction is the primary diagnosis. All individuals must be examined by a physician prior to admission to determine they are free from communicable diseases and to undergo a tuberculosis test. The cost of this exam and TB test is not included in our treatment rate.

PRE-ADMISSION PROCESS

Screening to determine appropriateness for addiction treatment at Blandine is typically done in an in-person, face-to-face interview by gathering information regarding:

- Past treatment(s)
- Risk factors
- General health information
- Substance abuse history
- Legal history
- Mental health status
- Resident Evacuation Assessment

Blandine's hours of admittance to our residential program are 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Due to the programming schedule in place for Fridays at the Blandine House, admissions on Fridays are at the discretion of the Treatment team.

DRUG OR ALCOHOL DETOX

We will not accept individuals who are in need of detoxification services by a hospital or detox center, therefore, detoxification may be necessary at a hospital or detox center prior to admission at Blandine House. Detoxification is sometimes necessary to prevent serious medical complications, such as delirium tremors or seizures.
